

GLASSCOCK COUNTY IS HIRING!

Glasscock County has an opening for a Justice of the Peace

Duties:

- Hears traffic and other Class C misdemeanor cases punishable by fine only.
- Hears civil cases with up to \$20,000 in controversy.
- Hears landlord and tenant disputes.
- Hears truancy cases.
- Performs magistrate duties.
- Conducts inquests.

The justice of the peace presides over the justice court in cases involving misdemeanors, small civil disputes, landlord/tenant disputes and more. They also conduct inquests and may perform marriage ceremonies.

The Justice of the Peace position is an elected position and the person would normally be placed into office by the voters of Glasscock County. The elected term of a Justice of the Peace is four years. Due to this position becoming vacant in the middle of the term the Glasscock County Commissioner's Court is tasked with appointing a Justice of the Peace to fill the remainder of the four-year term. The person that is appointed to this position will have to run for re-election in order to keep the job. The next term starts January 1, 2027.

Minimum Requirements:

Must be a Glasscock County Resident that has resided in Glasscock County for at least six months.

Must be a registered voter in Glasscock County.

Must be eligible to run for office in the State of Texas
